


# Shepherd's P.I.E.

... Pastoral Insights Expressed



Dear Friends,

We find ourselves in that novena of days between the Ascension of the Lord and the Outpouring of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost. From one perspective it is the end of the 50 days of the Easter season; however, from God's perspective, this is the New Beginning; the New Big Bang with fire and wind; the New Creation from within our fallen nature with Light and Breath. While the incredible nature of these paschal mysteries has been the subject of poetry and art throughout the past score of centuries; it should not be too easily dismissed simply as fluff for dreamers. Rather, it is the "stuff" of who we are and Whose we are!

Fundamental to our Catholic faith is the mystery of the Incarnation, that is, God in the immensity of His Love and superabundance of His Mercy freely chooses to enter into our wounded and fallen human nature that He had created in His own image and likeness. By being conceived in His Mother's womb and thus assuming a human body, Jesus takes our lowly flesh and blood in order to give us His most Sacred Body and Precious Blood. In this holy exchange, we give God the power to die, which He did not have; and He gives us the power to live for eternity, which we do not have on our own merit. This inestimable and precious gift had been entrusted to our first parents. By seeking to grasp that which did not belong to them (us) rather than allowing themselves (ourselves) to be grasped by Him, They (we) acted against human nature by grasping divinity "to be like God."

The great Lie that seduced Adam and Eve, led them to question who they were, in Whose image they had been created and Whose they were! In sowing the seeds of doubt and division, Satan leads human beings to choose against their human nature, against their body, against their soul and ultimately against God. Through the mystery of the Incarnation, God accepts a gift from human beings, through the consent of the Blessed Virgin

Mary. Her "Yes" gives God a human body by which Jesus assumes our human nature, takes on our flesh and enters into our human history. By the example of His life and the message of the Gospel, Jesus teaches us how human nature was meant to be lived as created by God and according to His loving design. And, if that was not enough, He experienced everything in our wounded nature, though guilty of none of its causes, even unto death—the horrific death of Roman crucifixion. The innocent One dies freely for the guilty and turns the penalty of their sins—death—into the passage to Eternal Life.

Objectively, in our human nature, because of the Death and Resurrection of Jesus, we are all redeemed and sit with Him at the right hand of the Father. Each of us personally, however, must choose freely to embrace our nature, that is God's Will, and re-integrate our being by inserting our "person" into our redeemed "nature." To assist us all the more, God sends us through the Risen Lord an Advocate, the Holy Spirit, who is poured into our personal hearts and a "new" incarnation (of sorts) occurs in which we are His adopted sons and daughters having the power of His love and grace to live. Our struggle is often rooted in the numb-skulled notion that freedom means a license to do whatever "I" want, whenever "I" want and however "I" want; however, to live freely means we have the freedom to act according to the truth of Creation and our God-created nature and to pursue His love above all things, which is ultimately the deepest desire of the human heart. As St. Augustine stated so eloquently: "O God, You have created us for Yourself, and our hearts are restless until they rest in You!" (*Confessions*, Book I) Let us open our hearts to the Holy Spirit!



### ST. ANDREW ELDER CARE MINISTRY Scam Alert from AARP

There are two typical scams involving gift cards: someone buys a gift card only to later discover that it has no balance on it, and someone is instructed to purchase gift cards and share the numbers as a form of payment. To combat zero-balance gift card scams: 1) purchase cards online directly from the business that issues them; 2) carefully examine cards at a physical store for signs of tampering; 3) register your card with the retailer if that option is offered. Regarding gift card payment scams: 1) if you are confronted by someone directing you to buy gift cards to pay for something or send money, it is a scam; 2) disengage immediately and report it to the FTC at [reportfraud.ftc.gov](http://reportfraud.ftc.gov); 3) if you lost money due to fraud, report it to your local police and insist that they take your report.

### Reflections from CCD / PREP by Sr. Theresa Marie Moore, PVMI

"Do you know what that says?" the young lady asked as she walked out the Convent door. "Not really, because it's in Latin, but I know it is a St. Benedict medal, and St. Benedict is especially powerful in protecting us from the devil, so we hung it on our door. Would you like one?" "Sure. Thanks!" she said with a big smile. Many people don't believe that there is a devil, a fallen angel, who is trying to push us away from God. That is one of the devil's tactics to trick us into choosing evil. As Catholics we have so many helps available to protect us from the attacks of the evil one.

Recently our Young Disciples (8<sup>th</sup> and 9<sup>th</sup> grade) learned how to put on the armor of God. They had a good time, even dressing up in mock armor. They also learned about the protection of the St. Benedict medal, the power of the Sacraments, the prayer to St. Michael the Archangel, the Rosary, etc. and how they can employ these in their daily lives. ### Prayers for PREP

Finally, draw your strength from the Lord and from his mighty power. Put on the armor of God so that you may be able to stand firm against the tactics of the devil. 
