

## Shepherd's P.I.E.

... Pastoral Insights Expressed



Dear Friends,

When we meet the disciples on the road to Emmaus, it is evening, and the sun's glow of that first Easter day has already begun to fade. The resurrection of Jesus, for Cleopas and his travelling companion, at this point is nothing more than a story or a rumor; however, buried deep within their nervous chatter rests a deep yearning and a holy hunger. As they make this frantic journey away from the epicenter of action, where Jesus was crucified and buried, they experience themselves as bundles of ambiguities. Their minds and hearts, like charged electric particles, race between the intimately intertwined contradictions of: skepticism and hope; severe doubt and their need for Jesus to be alive; the sense of abandonment and their profound longing for His Presence; their fearful running away and their courageous readiness to run back. But amidst their words of doubt, sadness and despair they are impeded to believe what Jesus had told them and they failed to recognize Him, as He accompanied them on their perilous journey.

After meeting the stranger along the road, however; something stirs deep within them and their hearts begin to burn with that original faith, hope and charity that was stirred into flame by Jesus of Nazareth. They are inspired to take the risk of speaking to and inviting this stranger, who seemed to be familiar... one of them, into their place of lodging and to share a meal. *"Stay with us, Lord, for it is almost evening."* (cf. Lk 24:29) This was the insistent invitation that the two disciples journeying to Emmaus on the evening of the day of the resurrection addressed to the Wayfarer who

had accompanied them on their journey. Weighed down with sadness, they never imagined that this stranger was none other than their Master, risen from the dead. Yet they felt their hearts burning within them (cf. v. 32) as He spoke to them and "explained" the Scriptures. The light of the Word unlocked the hardness of their hearts and "opened their eyes" (cf. v. 31). Amid the shadows of the passing day and the darkness that clouded their spirit, the Wayfarer brought a ray of light which rekindled their hope and led their hearts to yearn for the fullness of light. "Stay with us," they pleaded. And He agreed. Soon afterwards, Jesus' face would disappear, yet the Master would "stay" with them, hidden in the "breaking of the bread" which had opened their eyes to recognize Him. The image of the disciples on the way to Emmaus can serve as a fitting guide for... the Church [focused on]... living out the mystery of the Holy Eucharist. Amid our questions and difficulties, and even our bitter disappointments, the divine Wayfarer continues to walk at our side, opening to us the Scriptures and leading us to a deeper understanding of the mysteries of God. When we meet Him fully, we will pass from the light of the Word to the light streaming from the "Bread of life," the supreme fulfillment of His promise to "be with us always, to the end of the age." (cf. Mt 28:20) The "breaking of bread," as the Eucharist was called in earliest times, has always been at the center of the Church's life. Through it, Christ makes present within time the mystery of His death and resurrection. In it, He is received in person as the "living bread come down from heaven;" (Jn 6:51) and with Him, we receive the pledge of eternal life and a foretaste of the eternal banquet of the heavenly Jerusalem. (Pope St. John Paul II, Apostolic Letter, *Mane nobiscum Domine*, 7 October 2004; Introduction).

In this Easter season, let us let Jesus share the burden of the contradictions of our minds and hearts and entrust them into His wounded hands. Let us experience Jesus gazing deeply into our eyes and calling us to follow Him and our "Yes!" Let us recognize Him in the stranger who challenges us, in the one who comforts us, in the One who reveals Himself in the Holy Eucharist. May our prayer be unceasing, "*Mane nobiscum, Domine!* Remain with us, Lord."

## St. John's Hospice Casserole Program

Philadelphia's Office of Homelessness reported in 2022 that about 5,700 are considered homeless in the city, which includes about 950 who are unsheltered. Many factors cause homelessness: poverty, inability to afford a place to live, falling outside the system, mental illness, addiction, and lack of a strong social support network. Not all people who are on the street are homeless. Some are travelers, passing through from city to city, without means or desire for housing. Panhandlers are not necessarily homeless, but still need help to secure a better lifestyle. Many non-profits assist the government in trying to reach out to those living in public places. St. John's Hospice at 1221 Race Street is one such organization.

"I do not make that decision in my household," the first-grader said. Who makes the decisions in your household? For some decisions, we look to the head of the household-mom, dad, grandma, etc. For other decisions, we look to our boss, or maybe a faith leader for guidance. Ultimately, as Christians, we have to decide how we will respond to Christ's invitation. A few years ago, when I was doing door-to-door visitation, I met a man who was baptized Catholic but not practicing his faith. We had a short conversation, but nothing phenomenal. Three years later I met him again and he said that after our conversation, he was reflecting on how much the Church was under attack in our society. He felt like he was being called to make a decision then: whether to be a Christian in earnest or to walk away. He chose to embrace his faith and walk with Our Lord. Praise God!

Each of us is called to make such a decision. What is your answer?

The Most Blessed Sacrament is exposed in the monstrance for Adoration every Tuesday (September through June) until 7:00pm when the Divine Mercy Chaplet is prayed in reparation for the sins of sexual abuse and concludes with Benediction.

Sacrament of Baptism: Call the Parish Office to register for Pre-Jordan class prior to Baptism. Baptisms are administered on the 2<sup>nd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> Sundays of each month. Please refer to the Parish website regarding guidelines for Sacramental Sponsors / Godparents.

Sacrament of Reconciliation: Saturday 3:30 – 4:30pm, Sunday after 7:30am Mass, or by appointment with a priest.

Sacrament of Marriage: Couples should contact the Parish Office to request an appointment with the pastor prior to setting a date. Six months notification to prepare for marriage is expected; a full year is recommended.

Sacrament of Anointing and Sick Calls: Gather at the Altar of Our Lady following the 10:00am Sunday Mass for this Sacrament. Call the Parish Office to make arrangements for anointing or a Eucharistic visit for those who are unable to come to Church. Sick calls in an emergency will receive prompt attention.
