




## Respect Life Ministry News





# Shepherd's P.I.E.

... Pastoral Insights Expressed



Dear Friends,

The bishops of the United States have encouraged all of us, in this period of Eucharistic Revival, to make an intentional effort to develop a heightened awareness of and a deeper devotion to the mystery of the Holy Eucharist as the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of Jesus Christ, the immortal Son of the Eternal God, the second Person of the Most Holy Trinity and the Word of God "made flesh ... dwelling among us." This plea of our shepherds is not one simply to our intellects; rather, the deeper and more significant desire is that all of us "return to the Lord, with all our minds, souls and bodies," seek our rest and repose in His gentle and silent Presence, and be "revived," that is, brought back to life in our authentic and mutual participation of the Holy Communion of natures and wills to which He invites us. But, how do we do this?

God, through the voice of our shepherds, the successors to the Apostles, is calling us to STOP DOING, whatever it is that we are doing and get serious about life; not simply our life in the body here on earth, but the life of our body and soul ... our eternal life. God is pleading with us, with a Father's love, to stop living the lie, that we can do it alone, without Him or "my" way is better than "His way, truth and life." God is asking us to examine our hearts and lives and to entrust our distracted, restless and desperate hearts into His loving care; calling us to change our attitude toward and properly respect those things that are His. One important aspect of our lives as human beings that we seem to have lost is not simply silence, but stillness or composure. When we enter Church, we should be there to present ourselves to Him, talk to Him and listen to Him. It seems in most cases, however, that instead of leaving our earthly cares and "our" attempts to remedy them outside, we just continue to do the same thing in His space, disregarding His attempts to speak, to soothe and to heal us. We need to stop needlessly talking before, during and after Mass and make an effort to listen. We need to STOP DOING whatever it is that we're doing that isn't working and be still entrusting ourselves to our loving God. Allow me to share a reflection on "Composure," by Fr. Romano Guardini, from his classic guide to preparing oneself for Mass, titled *Meditations before Mass*. He writes:

Silence overcomes noise and talk; composure is the victory over distractions and unrest. Silence is the quiet of

a person who could be talking; composure is the vital, dynamic unity of an individual who could be divided by his surroundings, tossed to and fro by the myriad happenings of every day. What do we mean by composure? As a rule, a man's attention is broken into a thousand fragments by the variety of things and persons about him. His mind is restless; his feelings seek objects that are constantly changing; his desires reach out for one thing after another; his will is captured by a thousand intentions, often conflicting. He is often harried, torn and self-contradictory. Composure works in the opposite direction, rescuing man's attention from sundry objects holding it captive and restoring unity to his spirit. It frees him from its many tempting claims and focuses it on one, the all-important. It calls the soul that is dispersed over myriad thoughts and desires, plans and intentions back to itself, re-establishing its depth. ...We are constantly lured from the important and profound to the distracting, interesting, piquant. This state of affairs exists not only around us but within us. To a large extent, man lives without depth, without a center, in superficiality and chance. No longer finding the essential within himself, he grabs at all sorts of stimulants and sensations; he enjoys them briefly, tires of them, recalls his own emptiness and demands new distractions. He touches everything brought within easy reach of his mind by the constantly increasing means of transportation, information, education and amusement, but he doesn't really absorb anything. He contents himself with having "heard about it;" he labels it with some current catchword and shoves it aside for the next. He is a hollow man and tries to fill his emptiness with constant, restless activity. ... The moment quiet surrounds him, he is lost.

Composure is more than freedom from scattered impressions and occupations. It is something positive; it is life in its full depth and power. ... [Consider breathing] It has two directions: outward and inward. Both are vital; each is a part of this elementary function of life and neither is all of it. The living organism that only exhaled or inhaled, would soon suffocate. Composure is the spiritual man's "inhalation," by which, from deep within, he collects his scattered self and returns to his center. Only the composed person is really someone. Only he can be seriously addressed as one capable of replying. Only he is genuinely affected by what life brings him, for he alone is awake, aware. ...What we mean is true awareness: that inner knowledge of the essential; the ability to make responsible decisions—sensitivity, readiness and *joie de vivre*. (pp. 16-19)

By nature, their clients are more at risk of viruses and diseases, especially during outbreaks in the city. The pandemic only made this more evident. So St. John's has partnered with the city's Homeless Services and the Department of Public Health to provide vaccinations. The vaccination clinic was set up in the new Connelly Dining Room. This is just another way in which the hospice is looking out for the welfare of the less fortunate in the city of Philadelphia.

Sacrament of Baptism: Call the Parish Office to register for Pre-Jordan class prior to Baptism. Baptisms are administered on the 2<sup>nd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> Sundays of each month. Please refer to the Parish website regarding guidelines for Sacramental Sponsors / Godparents.

Sacrament of Reconciliation: Saturday 3:30 – 4:30p.m., Sunday after 7:30a.m. Mass, or by appointment with a priest.

Sacrament of Marriage: Couples should contact the Parish Office to request an appointment with the pastor prior to setting a date. Six months notification to prepare for marriage is expected; a full year is recommended.

Sacrament of Anointing and Sick Calls: Gather at the Altar of Our Lady following the 10:00a.m. Sunday Mass for this Sacrament. Call the Parish Office to make arrangements for anointing or a Eucharistic visit for those who are unable to come to Church. Sick calls in an emergency will receive prompt attention.
