


... Pastoral Insights Expressed



Dear Friends,

In the context of the Gospels presented in the first three Sundays of Lent, the common theme, that might be missed, is our status as the beloved children of God. At His Baptism, Jesus is affirmed as God's Beloved Son prior to going out into the desert. There after fasting from the "things" of this earth, Jesus focuses His attention on and grounds His public ministry on His true identity and resists the temptations of the devil, ("If you are the Son of God...") because He never for an instant doubted His relationship with the Father. At the Transfiguration event, our Lord's Son-ship is reaffirmed and the splendor of His true dignity is revealed in a flash. And as a result, hope is given to each of us, that like the fig tree, we too will be given another year, another opportunity to bear fruit. These accounts are not meant simply to focus our attention on the life of Jesus some 2000 years ago; rather, they are meant to challenge us to accept the dignity of our genuine status as sons and daughters created in the image and likeness of the Eternal Father, redeemed by the Blood of Christ and filled with the Holy Spirit. Lent is an invitation to journey from ashes to Easter into authentic truth and mystery of who we truly are.

In light of today's Gospel in which we see the flipside of the coin, that our "Sonship" is rooted in God's "Fatherhood;" allow me, to share with you the beginning of an article from a few years ago. This is how Dudley Hall begins his post, titled "What Should We Do When We Fail?"

It just popped up as a text on my smart phone. I read it and choked up.

RELIGION: "I've messed up. My dad is going to kill me."

SON-SHIP: "I've messed up. I'd better call my dad."

This accurately expresses the deepest heart-cry of both a failing child and a caring father. Every sane father

wants his child to call when he/she is in trouble. There is no mire too messy to get in, if your child is in it. Every failing child wishes for a father who would understand, and get involved. Literature is replete with examples of such stories. Maybe the most popular is the story of the "prodigal son." (Luke 15)

The parable of the "Prodigal Son" is probably one of the most known parables of Jesus. The genius of Jesus' use of parables is particularly highlighted in the telling of this story. Regardless of your faith background, what human being cannot relate to the drama so beautifully played out in this literary device? Its message touches the deepest chord in our human nature, not simply in how it relates to the love of a child. As people of faith, however, we see clearly how Jesus' mission is to reveal the Father and how this parable, in particular, reflects our relationship with our all-loving heavenly Father. While historically we focus our attention on and are astonished by the drama between the father and the younger son, as their emotional reunion is reported; there is so much more to the story. First, we often, if not always, forget about the role and response of the third protagonist, the older son, who like the younger brother, doesn't really appreciate his Father and the gift that he has and is by being his son. The younger son with greater flair physically takes his so-called "fair share" and with respect neither to his father nor himself squanders that which he never earned. The older son is not innocent in this regard either. He fulfills all that is required of him, but does it out of duty or fear or simply out of religion, but not out of love. He is "doing" for his father grudgingly and never takes the time to bask in "being" the son of so gracious a father. In fact, both sons, despite the perception of their actions, have left the "Father's home." In fact, the gracious Father runs out of the comfort of his home to greet both of his sons. Now, obviously, the greeting of the younger son is more intense, but it is in direct relation to the rather extreme route the young man chose to follow. And while the father's "going out" to the older son is not supported with the bling of a "new cloak" or "ring" or "fatted calf;" this exodus from the comfort of his home and the joy of his son's return is far more intimate and profound. He explains the "gift" the older son is and possesses. The father is probably deeply saddened by the fact that the son, he thought was safe and with him, has not yet come to the realization that the younger son has just already attained. Today's Gospel is a beautiful lesson in real masculinity rooted in the Fatherhood of God. Any man can sire children. Real men, courageous to tell the truth and humble enough to give themselves in love, can be fathers/dads/*Abba*. Be of good cheer, have a blessed week and a fruitful Lent!

“Say the Word”

Reflections from St. Andrew CCD / PREP

Kids are very honest. In a discussion of joining the parish for Mass on Sunday, a girl may say, "No. We do fun things on Sunday!" When a tour of the Church is going a little too long for a student, he might say, "I'm done." They also share what is important to them like the child who might greet me with, "E-A-G-L-E-S, Eagles!" Another wants to volunteer a younger sibling to read, proud of how good they are at reading. You're never quite sure what response you'll get to any topic.

This week, we were joining Pope Francis in praying for Russia and Ukraine, in preparation for the Consecration of those two nations to the Immaculate Heart of Mary on the Feast of the Annunciation. When one catechist told the children they would be praying for Russia, they responded, very honestly, "Why would we do that?!" When they had prayed for the people of Ukraine the week before, there had been no questions like this. What a beautiful opportunity to explain that Jesus taught us to pray for our enemies, and that even from the Cross He was praying for those who crucified Him. This is an opportunity to be more like Jesus. Another beautiful thing about children is that when you speak from the heart, they can really get the point. They got it, and they prayed for Russia.

Prayers for PREP - (from the Act of Consecration to the Immaculate Heart of Mary by Pope Pius XII) Lord Jesus, we join together in prayer as the Holy Father prepares to consecrate Russia and Ukraine to your Mother's Immaculate Heart. May our prayers of consecration be united with the Pope, the bishops and all the faithful and may the promises of peace by Our Lady of Fatima be fulfilled.

Most Holy Virgin Mary, tender Mother of men, to fulfill the desires of the Sacred Heart of Jesus and the request of the Vicar of Your Son on earth, we consecrate ourselves and our families to your Sorrowful and Immaculate Heart, O Queen of the Most Holy Rosary, and we recommend to You, all the people of our country and all the world. Daily Visitation: The Church is open for visitation weekdays from the first Mass until 5:00 PM; Saturdays until after the 5:00 PM Vigil Mass and Sundays until 1:45 PM. The Most Blessed Sacrament is exposed in the monstrance for Adoration every Tuesday (September through June) until 7:00 PM when the Divine Mercy Chaplet is prayed in reparation for the sins of sexual abuse and concludes with Benediction.

Sacrament of Baptism: Call the Parish Office to register for Pre-Jordan class prior to Baptism. Baptisms are administered on the 2nd and 4th Sundays of each month. Please refer to the Parish website regarding guidelines for Sacramental Sponsors / Godparents.

Sacrament of Reconciliation: Saturday 3:30 – 4:30 PM, Sunday after 7:30 AM Mass, or by appointment with a priest.

Sacrament of Marriage: Couples should contact the Parish Office to request an appointment with the pastor prior to setting a date. Six months notification to prepare for marriage is expected; a full year is recommended.

Sacrament of Anointing and Sick Calls: Gather at the Altar of Our Lady following the 10:00 AM Sunday Mass for this Sacrament. Call the Parish Office to make arrangements for anointing or a Eucharistic visit for those who are unable to come to Church. Sick calls in an emergency will receive prompt attention.
